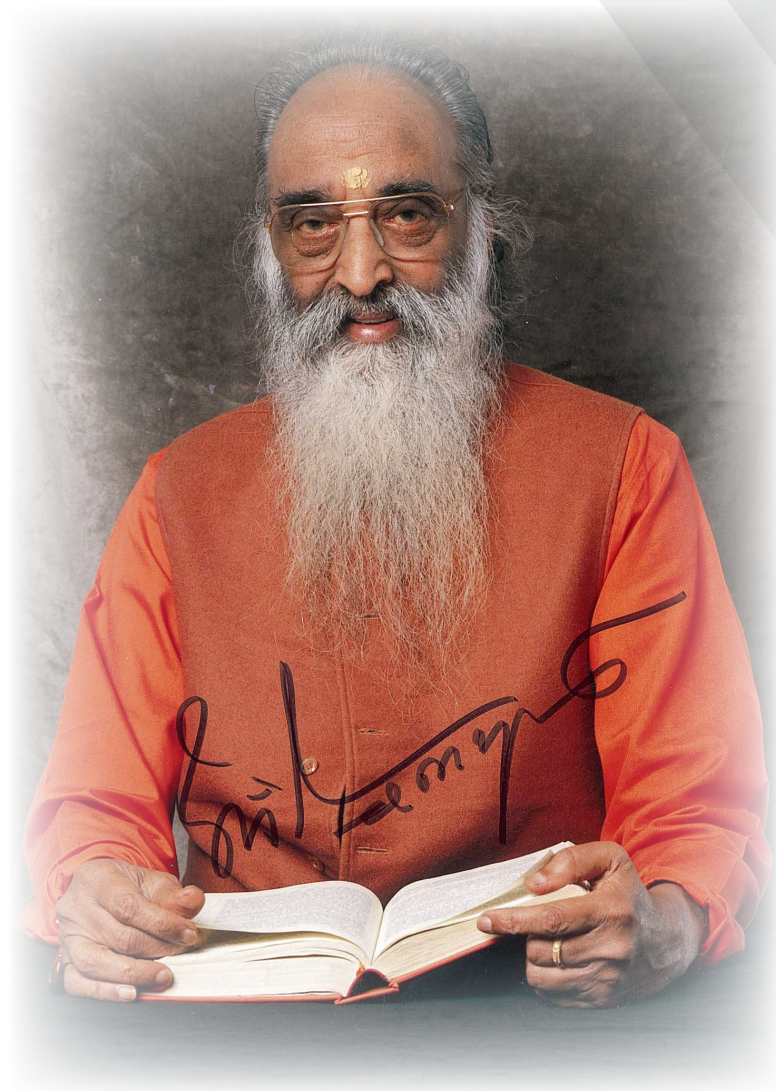

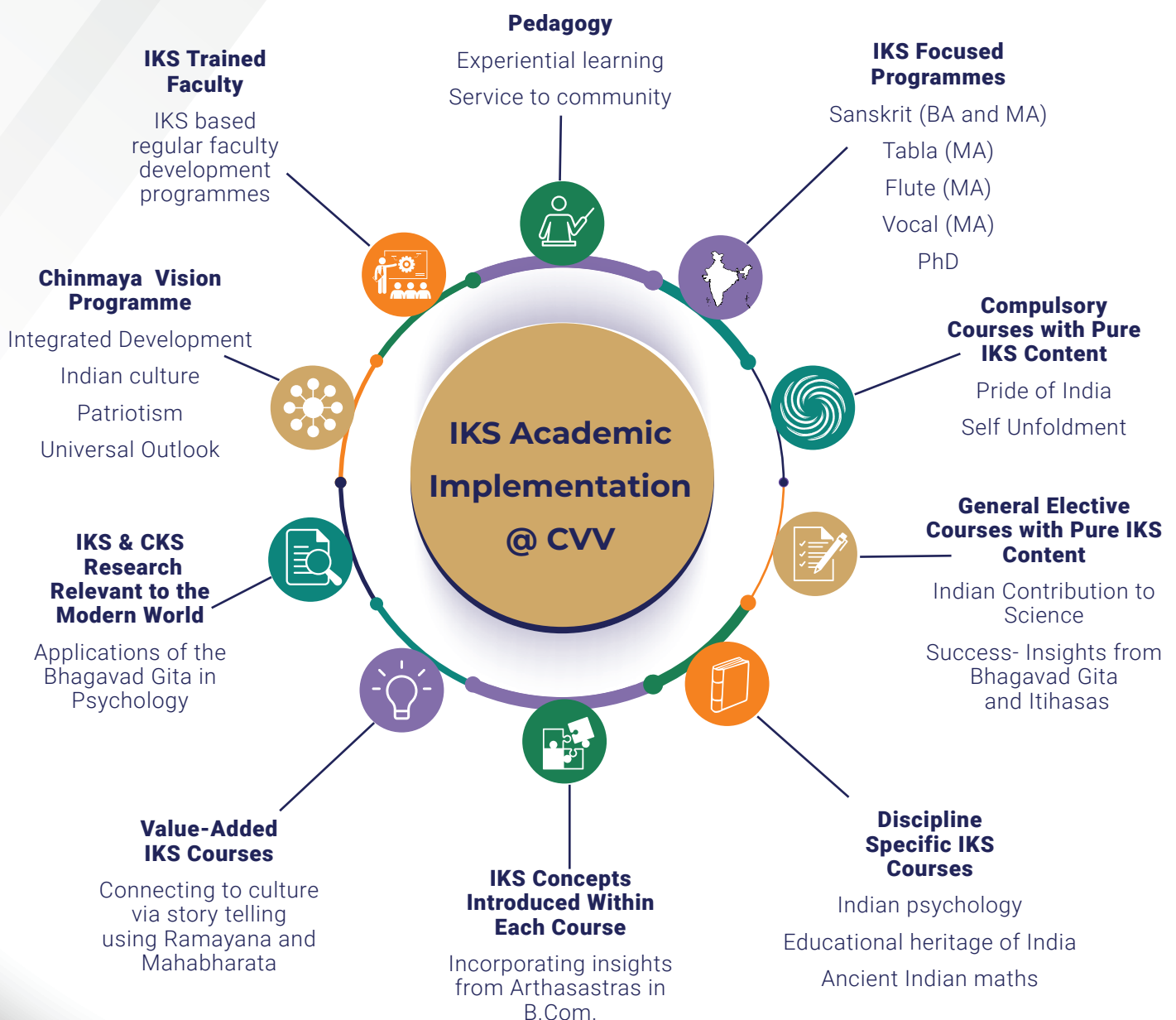

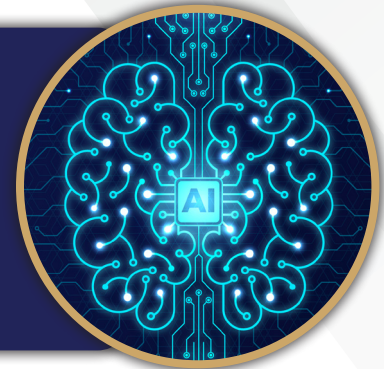

Assessment

Evaluation and assessment are of vital importance in estimating the overall progress of students. The future of a student is determined by their performance in examinations. At CVV, all efforts are taken to ensure that the assessment system adopted is fair, efficient, reliable, transparent and strictly follows the examination rules and regulations formulated by the University. The grading policy as specified by UGC in the CBCS scheme is being followed to maintain uniformity across institutions. This is based on a 10-point grading system with letter grading in compliance with UGC norms. The students' final performance is indicated by a single composite measure viz. the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

The evaluation of students in each course of a programme is designed as per the course outcome and is based on Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) carried out during the semester and University Examinations (UE) conducted at the end of the semester. The ratio of weightage is 30% CIA and 70% UE for undergraduate programmes and 50% for both CIA and UE for postgraduate programmes.

Faculty at CVV ensure that the students are aware of the evaluation criteria in CIA and UE. It is explained to them in detail to enhance the transparency and rigour to focus on individual and original work. The framework of CIA consists of multiple components such as assignments, tests, quizzes etc. and provides effective mid-course corrections. It is mandatory for students to appear for the UE in all registered theory and practical courses for completion of the requirements of the programme.

The eligibility criteria for appearing for the UE are 75% attendance and 40% in CIA for all courses under UG and 75% attendance and 50% in CIA for all courses under PG programmes offered by CVV. For getting a passing grade of 'P' for UG or 'B' for PG, a student shall secure a minimum of 40% mark from both CIA and UE evaluation components in each course of UG programmes and a minimum of 50% mark from both CIA and UE evaluation components in each course of PG programmes.

The results of examinations are usually announced on the University website within ten working days from the date of the last examination. The performance of a student is represented by the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) which are calculated by the standard methods.

CVV has in place a robust system to address the various examination related grievances of students. Programme specific details of the evaluation pattern can be found in the curriculum document of the respective programmes.

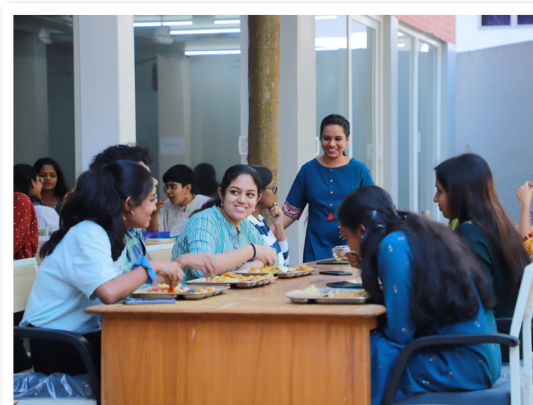
Library

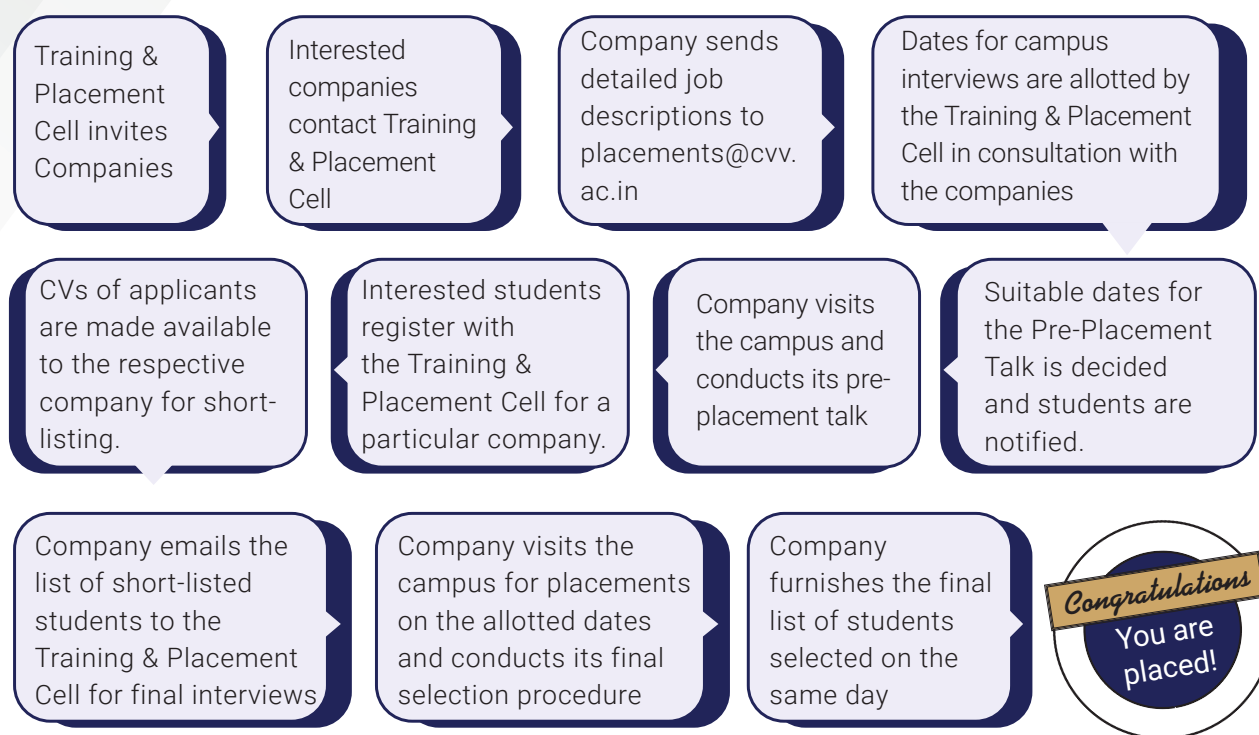

Admission Policies

Evaluation Policy:

The admission decisions are based on the following policies:

- The admissions process is entirely merit-based, after compliance with regulations pertaining to reservations, as prescribed by the UGC.
- No other formal or informal recommendations from or through any individuals or entities will be entertained or considered.
- CVV does not have a deferral policy. The admission offer is only valid for the programme starting in August 2023.
- CVV's admission panel will conduct additional tests/personal interviews as required.
- Only candidates meeting the above criteria will be considered for selection.

Misrepresentation of Information:

CVV will verify all original certificates or mark sheets supporting the application at the time of enrolment. CVV will not tolerate any instance of falsification of information submitted by candidates. The admission shall immediately stand cancelled and fees forfeited, in case it is discovered at any stage that any of the information submitted was false.

Privacy Policy:

All information submitted by the applicants will be confidential, except as desired by the law.

Financial Aid:

Admission to CVV is merit-based. However, financial aid is need-based. An applicant's need for financial aid will not affect their selection for the programme. Need-based financial aid will be assessed by CVV for such number of students and up to such extent of aid as is permissible from the endowments created by the Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth. All financial aid is at the absolute discretion of the CVV management.

All accepted students start their journey at the University with the registration process that confirms formal enrolment into the University.

SELECTION PROCESS

Declaration of Result:

CVV shall evaluate the candidature of every applicant based on the relevant selection criteria after receipt of a completed application form along with the required documents within the application deadlines. Evaluation tests or interviews may be applicable at CVV's discretion. The admission results will be announced as per the admission schedule. If you are selected, you will receive a copy of your offer letter by email as well.

Once applicants have gone through the interaction with the faculty team, they may expect one of the following communications:

- Provisional offer of admission
- Waitlisted - Deferment of admission
- Denial of admission

Acceptance of the Offer:

Selected candidates need to accept their admissions offer within the validity period. The additional requisite documentation/information to be submitted with the acceptance will be detailed in the offer letter.

Joining Details:

CVV will communicate all the necessary information about the date of joining such as reporting date and time, academic calendar, housing details, documents to be submitted during enrolment, items to bring to campus, and induction schedule before the commencement of the academic programme. Please check your registered email regularly.

Procedure for Refund

A student desiring to withdraw the admission shall submit a request in the prescribed format. The candidate should enclose the original fee receipt along with the application. The concerned authority shall forward the request to the Accounts Department for further processing. The refund amount, as applicable, will be credited in the bank account specified in the request form.

Documents Required For Admission Of International Students

VISA: All international students will require a 'Student VISA' endorsed to our institution for joining full-time courses. No other endorsement is acceptable. Students wishing to join a research programme will require a 'Research VISA' endorsed to our institution. The visa should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course. A visa may be obtained after issuing an offer of admission.

A visa is not required for NRI students. Students who are doing full-time courses in other institutions do not require a separate visa for joining 'part-time courses' provided their current visa is valid for the entire duration of the course.

All International students wishing to undertake research work or join an MSc/MPhil/PhD programme will have to obtain prior security clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and the approval of the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, and this must be on the student visa/research visa endorsed to this institution.

TC/CCL: A letter of recommendation from their respective foreign school/university with the official seal and signature (registrar/head of the institution).

FRR0 registration is to be done after the student joins the course.

Eligibility:

Qualifications: Only those students who have qualified from foreign universities or boards of higher education recognised as equivalent by our University authorities are eligible for admission.

When required, a reference will be made to the embassy of the country of their origin to check the equivalence. In case the university/board is not found satisfactory, the candidate has to obtain proper authentication from AIU.

Submission of an Equivalence Certificate from AIU is mandatory for foreign nationals. The AIU address is as below:

Code of Conduct

Breach of discipline can range from non-compliance with rules and regulations to breaking the code of conduct. Any act, behaviour or conduct on the part of a student adversely affecting the general discipline on the campus, violating thereby the academic atmosphere in the campus, such as inciting hostility, ill will, social disharmony amongst the students, ragging, bullying, indulging in vandalism or destruction of the University's property, misbehaving with the faculty and staff members, being detrimental to the educational process of the University in any manner, or bringing disrepute to the University will be treated as misconduct. Any unlawful act or indulgence in any act of public nuisance outside the University will also be treated as misconduct, besides allowing the law to take its course. Without prejudice to the generality of the above, the following acts/behaviour/conduct will also be treated as misconduct and may attract disciplinary action:

- Smoking, consumption and distribution of alcohol or any other intoxicating or contraband substances inside the campus.
- Wilful disobedience of the rules/regulations/orders/instructions issued.
- Disruption of day-to-day activities within the campus premises, including politicising of the activities.
- Breach of Hostel Rules.
- Cybercrimes.
- Public display of affection on campus.

Mobile phones and recording equipment are strictly not allowed (unless otherwise instructed by the University authorities) within the classroom, library, computer centre, and various offices/ places as the University may specify from time to time. While the use of a laptop in the library is permitted, its use in classrooms shall be as per the directions of the specific instructors. Any form of misconduct will be dealt with severely and may entail penalties ranging up to suspension or expulsion from the programme. All the students are required to strictly adhere to the class timings as prescribed in their respective timetables. Wilful misuse or damage to University property or facilities will lead to disciplinary action/termination of registration of a student/ attract charges to pay for the damages, as the case may be.

Dress Code

- On the academic premises, students shall appear only in formal or semi-formal dresses. No student is permitted to enter any academic or administrative premises including classrooms, library, computer centre, faculty blocks or any offices in the University with an improper dress code. Any violation of these norms will be considered misconduct.
- All are recommended to wear modest and comfortable Indian clothing; shorts /tights/ sleeveless/revealing clothes are not permitted.
- Informal or improper dress includes sleeveless shirts/blouses, half pants, shorts, Bermuda, half skirts or other similar outfits.

- We recommend that students have with them at least one sweater/shawl/jacket to keep warm during monsoon/winter and at least two pairs of clothes which are comfortable for exercise/yoga.
- It is advised to have one or two sets of Indian traditional clothes for special occasions.
- **Boys:** Formal shirts and trousers, casual t-shirts. Round/V-neck t-shirts and normal jeans are permitted. Torn jeans, low-waist jeans/cut jeans/shorts/sleeveless garments are not permitted.
- **Girls:** Formal/semi-formal dress/salwar kameez/kurtis. Casual t-shirts and round/v-neck t-shirts are permitted. Normal jeans are permitted. Torn jeans, low waist jeans/cut jeans/shorts/sleeveless garments are not permitted.

Policy on Prevention of Sexual Harassment

CVV undoubtedly nurtures the philosophy that the institution is a holy place where education transforms students and employees based on equality and freedom among all students/employees, particularly women. Its policy on Prevention of Sexual Harassment at the Workplace has been framed in line with the recommendations of University Grants Commission and the directives of the Hon. Supreme Court.

The institution is committed to ensure safety and security of women and conducts various programmes on gender sensitization in the campus.

Objectives of the Policy

- To fulfill the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and UGC directives in respect of implementing a policy against sexual harassment at CVV.
- To evolve a mechanism for the prevention and redressal of sexual harassment cases and other acts of gender based violence in the institution.
- To ensure the implementation of the policy in letter and spirit through proper reporting of the complaints and their follow-up procedures.
- To provide an environment free of gender-based discrimination.
- To ensure equal access of all facilities and participation in activities of the university
- To create a secure physical and social environment which will deter acts of sexual harassment
- To promote a social and psychological environment that will raise awareness about sexual harassment in its various forms.

It is emphasized that CVV shall have a zero tolerance policy towards sexual harassment in the entire campus and shall provide for timely and adequate compliance of the directions in this regard contained in the UGC Regulations 2015.

Hostel Rules And Regulations

Administration

The hostel and the mess are under the purview of the Registry which is responsible for the hostel and mess administration, and hostel discipline, with support from the administrative staff including Hostel Wardens. The University's decision shall be final in the interpretation of the rules and all matters connected with the hostel. The Office of the Registrar has the power to issue standing orders to regulate internal matters and other details not explicitly covered by these rules concerning the hostels and students' actions outside the classroom.

Admission

Only students of full-time programmes who are in the current rolls of CVV may be allowed to stay in the hostels as per the approved room allotment. Admission to any other category of students shall be decided by the University authorities and rules/guidelines are subject to amendment from time to time.

In addition, the students and parents are directed to fill out the hostel admission and Hostel Undertaking forms.

Allotment of Rooms

Rooms will be allotted as decided by the University. The mutual exchange of rooms is not permitted. In exceptional cases, where serious health/medical issues are involved, the Office of the Registrar, upon recommendation from the Hostel Warden(s), may consider a written request supported with convincing support documents for a change of rooms.

Withdrawal

- Students should on no account vacate the hostel unless they are permitted to do so by the Hostel Warden upon instruction from the Registrar.
- Students shall obtain a clearance certificate at the end of each semester. The 'No Dues Certificate' shall be submitted to the Office of the Registrar.

General Discipline

Students shall keep their room, its surroundings and hostel premises clean. The rooms, doors, windows, cupboards, etc. should not be disfigured by writing or sticking handbills, posters, etc. If any damage is noticed, the inmates will have to pay the cost of repairs as decided by the University.

- Students should behave with restraint and decorum at all times during their stay at CVV. They should not indulge in activities which could cause inconvenience to others or disturb

the sanctity of the campus as it is located within the precincts of a place of great spiritual and cultural importance.

- Students are not allowed to remove any article from the hostel or rooms. Any damage to the hostel property shall be immediately reported to the Hostel Wardens. The cost of the damage will be recovered from the individual/s concerned. If the person is not traced, the students in that wing or floor will be held responsible for and collectively charged. In cases where the University decides so, all the students of a particular hostel or block may be held responsible for the recovery. In case of wanton damage, in addition to the recovery of the cost of repair, the University may impose a suitable fine and take stern disciplinary action against those held responsible. In serious cases of destructive action, penalties can range up to expulsion from the programme.
- Each student will be responsible for the furniture supplied to him/her. The cost of repair of the tables, chairs, beds, etc. (other than that due to normal wear-and-tear) will be recovered from the individual student or students occupying the room. The students may bring in other articles only with the written request and subsequent permission from the Registrar. Those found violating this norm will face disciplinary action including the levy of heavy fines. The articles found in violation of the norms may be confiscated.
- Students should see that lights, fans, etc. are switched off when they are not in use or when they leave the room. Electrical installations should not be tampered with. Residents are not permitted to fit electrical fittings, heaters, and other appliances in the rooms. Those found violating this norm will face disciplinary actions including the levy of heavy fines. The articles found in violation of such norms may be confiscated.
- Cooking inside the rooms is strictly prohibited. Violation of this norm shall be treated as serious misconduct.
- Residents are expected to lock their rooms properly when they go out. The University is not responsible for any loss or damage to their belongings.
- No activities other than academic or co-curricular activities are permitted in the hostel.
- Students are expected to behave politely with hostel staff, which includes the cleaning and mess staff and security guards.
- No student shall be absent for any night from the hostel without the prior permission of the Hostel Warden. If a student finds it necessary to leave the hostel in an emergency and is unable to meet the Hostel Warden, he/she must, before his/her departure, submit in writing the reason for his/her absence to the Chief Hostel Warden.
- Students shall not use electrical appliances which have high electricity consumption.
- Students shall not keep weapons, ammunition and/or explosives; retention of which is illegal and unlawful, in the hostel. Storing petrol, kerosene oil or any other inflammable material in the room is forbidden.
- Indulgence in any anti-institutional or anti-social activity in the hostel is highly punishable and will be liable for severe penalties and punishments for indulging in such acts.
- No damage whatsoever, including defacing to the property of the hostels and understand that it will be liable for penalties and punishments for doing so.

Holidays/Vacation

- Personal belongings of the students proceeding on vacation may be left behind in their respective rooms till they return. All such articles must be packed, properly labelled and entrusted to the Hostel Wardens for safe custody in the rooms earmarked for this purpose.
- While every effort will be made to see that the articles are kept safely, the hostel authorities are not responsible for any loss or damage caused. Students are therefore advised not to leave behind any costly items when they go on vacation. The University reserves the right to allocate any room for any academic activity or undertake repair and maintenance work during holidays/vacations.
- Every student must vacate his/her room before proceeding on summer vacation and surrender the room to the administrative staff/Hostel Warden. If any room is found locked, the hostel authorities have the right to break open the same and the cost of damages will be accounted to the respective student.
- The room is to be vacated by the student after the completion of their respective programmes within two weeks after the last exam/final year/semester/trimester unless the hostel authorities give a specific date for the same. All students are required to clear their hostel dues, penal charges, recoveries on loss or damage caused etc., to be eligible to be issued a 'No Dues Certificate' required for receiving the completion certificates and Degree/Diploma certifications.
- The Office of the Registrar may consider applications from residents for staying in the hostels during a vacation on charges as notified by the University if their vacation academic activity (such as summer placements) requires them to be stationed.

Guest Rules and Guidelines

- No student is allowed to bring a guest into the hostel for an overnight stay with him/her except under exceptional circumstances where a parent or a sibling is to be accommodated on a special occasion with prior written request and approval from the Office of the Registrar. If any family member is required to stay overnight with the student, the student must seek and obtain prior explicit formal permission from the Office of the Registrar. Any failure in this shall be treated as serious misconduct. Other than an overnight stay in such circumstances, the stay of an outsider in the hostel is not permitted.
- The Office of the Registrar has the power to refuse permission to allow guests into the hostel, without assigning any reason.
- The guests, if any, permitted are subject to the rules and regulations of the hostel.
- The hostel maintains a register of guests and no guest is admitted, irrespective of the permission granted by the Office of the Registrar unless the name and other particulars are entered in the register. The student who brings the guest will be responsible for the proper filling up of the particulars required therein.
- The student introducing a guest is responsible for all charges incurred by the guest. The University will notify the guest of charges including rentals from time to time.

Anti-ragging Measures

Chinmaya Vishwa Vidyapeeth (CVV) is committed to providing a safe and inclusive educational environment that promotes the holistic development of its students. In accordance with the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, CVV strictly prohibits ragging on its campuses. Any violation will be dealt with according to the law in force and as per the directives of the Supreme Court of India and UGC.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009

CVV has adopted the ["UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009"](#) (as amended);

Ragging means any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Section 4: Whoever commits, participates in, abets or propagates 'ragging' within or without any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs.10,000/-(Rupees Ten thousand).

Section 5: Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

CVV has established a conducive environment for promoting finer human values and healthy human relations. Hence, students are advised not to indulge in ragging but to rise up against this evil and prevent it forever for a peaceful academic life and better career prospects. CVV has implemented several measures in line with the UGC Regulations to prevent and eliminate ragging:

Anti-Ragging Committee: CVV has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee, as mandated by the UGC Regulations. The committee comprises senior faculty members, administrative personnel, representatives from student bodies, and external members. It is responsible for ensuring the effective implementation and monitoring of the Anti-Ragging Policy.

Anti-Ragging Squad: CVV maintains an Anti-Ragging Squad consisting of faculty members, hostel wardens, and student representatives. The squad conducts regular patrols and surprise visits to prevent and detect any instances of ragging. It acts promptly upon receiving any complaints and takes immediate action to ensure the safety and well-being of students.

Awareness Programs: CVV organizes orientation programs and awareness campaigns at the beginning of each academic year to sensitize students about the negative consequences of ragging. These programs also educate students about the various channels available for reporting incidents of ragging, in compliance with the UGC Regulations.

Punishments for Ragging:

CVV strictly adheres to the UGC Regulations in curbing the menace of ragging in HEIs 2009, (No. F 1-16/2007 CPP(II), April 2009). regarding the punishment for ragging offenses. The penalties for offenders may include, but are not limited to, the following:

Suspension: As per the UGC Regulations, students found guilty of ragging may face suspension from the institution for a specified period, ranging from one to four semesters, depending on the gravity of the offense.

Expulsion: In severe cases where ragging leads to significant physical or psychological harm or poses a threat to the safety of students, the offender may be expelled from CVV, as stated in the UGC Regulations.

Legal Action: CVV complies with the UGC Regulations and cooperates with law enforcement agencies. Offenders involved in ragging may face legal consequences, which may include imprisonment, as per the provisions of the law, as emphasized by the UGC Regulations.

According to the UGC vide letter D. O. No. F. 3-2/2021 (ARC) dated 27 October 2021, the UGC has revised the guidelines pertaining to the affidavit to be filled by the prospective students and their parents on the official website – www.antiragging.in

Further to that, a reference number will be provided, which the student needs to disclose to the officials during the time of registration so that the same can be referenced in their respective application forms.

CVV Anti-Ragging Cell consists of Chairperson, Faculty representatives, Staff representatives, Student representatives, Parent representative, Civil Administration representative, Police Administration representative, NGO representative and Local Media representatives.

As per the UGC notification F.1-13/2022 (CPP-II), titled "University Grants Commission (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023," the UGC has exercised its powers conferred under clause (g) of sub-section (1) of Section 26 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 (3 of 1956). Students can now have the opportunity to register their complaints through the Student Grievance Redressal Cell (SGRC) of CVV. This provision aims to ensure an effective system for addressing student grievances and promoting a fair and supportive educational environment.
