ECONOX: THE ECONOMIC SOCIETY OF CVS

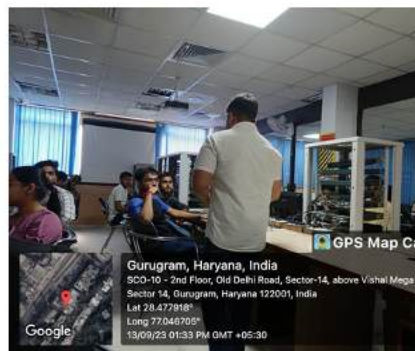

ROTARACT CLUB

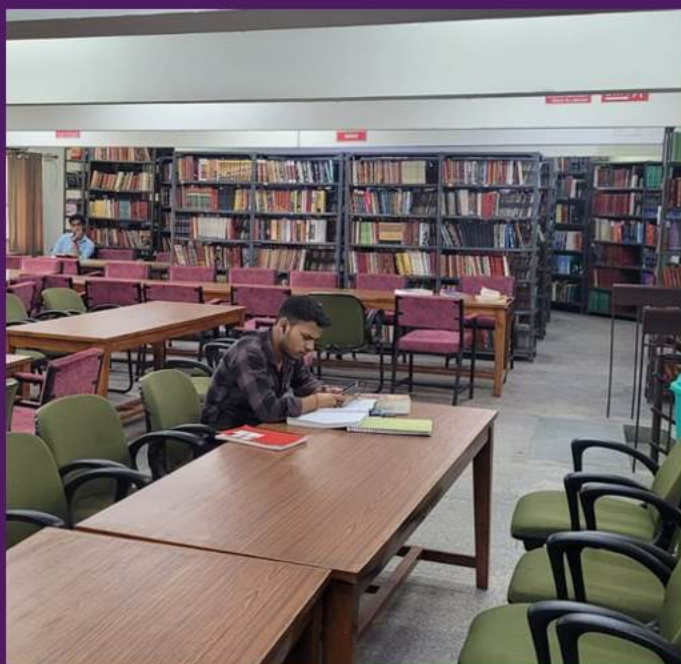

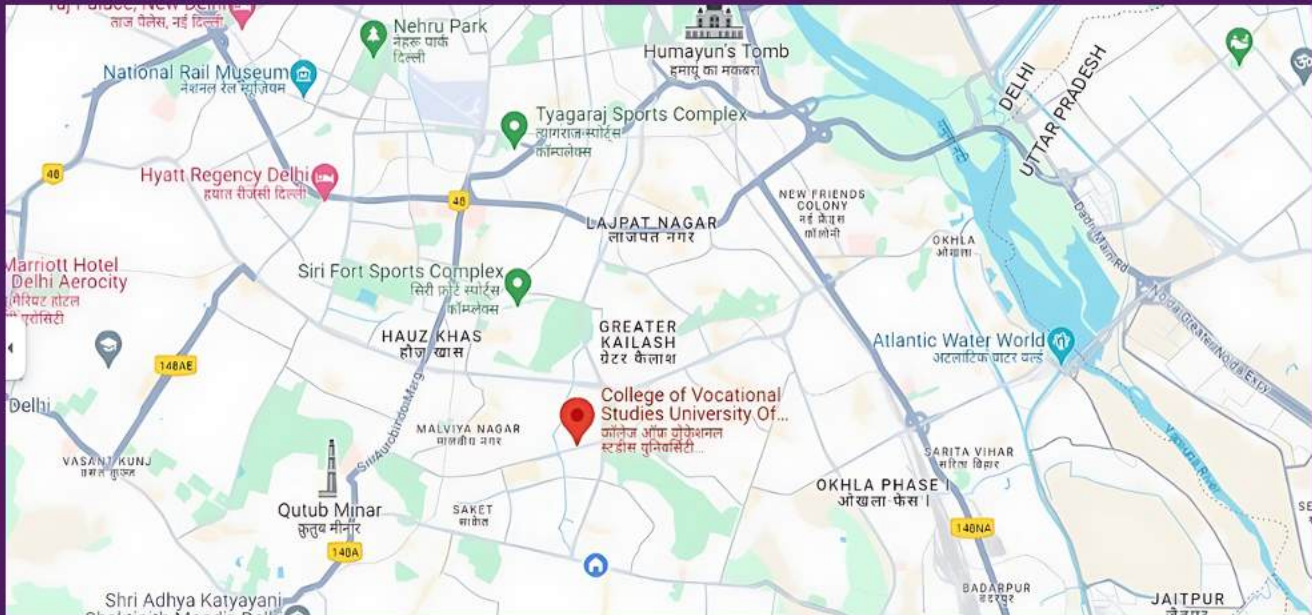
