TNNLU, one of the youngest, premier, and fully residential National Law Universities in the country, was established in 2012 by the Tamil Nadu Act No. 09 of 2012. TNNLU is recognised under section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act 1956. Further, the UGC has accorded section 12 B status of the UGC Act, 1956 to TNNLU and has sanctioned financing under the on-going XII plan. The undergraduate programmes are recognised by the Bar Council of India, New Delhi. TNNLU is a member of DELNET, Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute, The Institute of Company Secretaries of India, Association of Indian Universities, Asian Law Institute. TNNLU is a permanent member of the Indian Academy of Social Sciences and is the only institution from South India and one of the 11 institutions in the whole country which are currently empanelled by the Competition Commission of India for competition assessment. TNNLU is also a member of the National Digital Library of India (NDLI) and the only Law University till date to join the NDLI. TNNLU has MoUs with the National Law School of India University, the India International Institute of Democracy and Election Management of the Election Commission of India, National Law University Delhi and is in the process of exploring more MoUs with other institutions of national and international academic repute.

TNNLU Resources at a Glance

The TNNLU Library

TNNLU Library has good print and e-resources collection. Print collection includes a well-stocked text and reference books section and all major law reports and other periodicals. Remote access is provided to all the e-resources. The three storied Library Block also houses a Museum, as well as the TNNLU Moot Court Hall. There are three spacious silent Reading Halls and about half a dozen group discussion rooms which witness various moot teams congregating to prepare written and oral submissions. It also has an E-Library with about 25 desktop computers with wired internet connectivity. A Photocopier section operates on the third floor. Legal History Museum

TNNLU has the distinction of having a Legal History Museum on its premises. Multi-Stakeholder Engagement Approach in Research and Outreach

Student Clubs and Committees

Co-curricular and extracurricular activities - quintessential part of a vibrant campus life. The Students Activities Forum (SAF) is the umbrella organization of all the students' committees, clubs, societies etc. SAF has the mandate of giving policy direction and oversight. The SAF Executive Committee headed by the Vice Chancellor comprises of the Faculty Convenor, Faculties in charge and Convenors and co-convenors of each of the students' committees, clubs, societies etc.

The Moot Court Committee coordinates the selection of teams for participation in various national and international moot court competitions, honing research and advocacy skills. The TNNLU Annual Intra-University Moot Court is a much sought after event by all the seasoned mooters. TNNLU-CCI National Moot Court Competition, a flagship event conducted annually in association with the Competition Commission of India, sees participation of the law student's community from across the sub-continent and has grown tremendously. Similarly, Alternative Dispute Resolution and other co-curricular activities are coordinated by the respective committees/clubs. In the TNNLU Inter-University Debate Competition debaters from various law as well as other institutions get a chance to improve their acumen in reasoning and convincing. The TNNLU Legal Aid Committee in association with the District Legal Services Authority runs a free weekly Legal Aid Clinic. This committee was responsible for producing 5 short films to disseminate Legal Awareness among the public at large; for making the short films TNNLU received funding from the Tamil Nadu Innovation Initiatives (TANII) for short films on legal issues.

Annual Cultural and Sports Fests and the Ethnic Day celebrations add colour to the campus life. TNNLU celebrates diversity in unique ways and attempts have been made in the past at poetry translation into multiple Indian languages as part of the Ethnic Day events. Infrastructure at a glance

About Campus

The lush green campus of TNNLU is spread across an area of 25 acres with infrastructure including the UG Academic Block, PG Academic Block, Library, Administrative Block, Auditorium, 2 Multi-

Purpose Halls cum Mini Auditoriums, Training Centre, Amenities Block and Guest Accommodation. It also boasts of the 3 residential bungalows and 6 multi-storied blocks of teaching and administrative staff quarters.

Hostels

Being a compulsory residential University, separate hostels for men and women students with mess facilities are available within the campus. Rooms are allotted on shared basis for UG Students. Whereas for PG Students, single rooms may be allotted depending upon availability. General welfare of students is managed through Welfare and Disciplinary Committee and Mess Committee under the guidance of a Resident Warden and Faculty-in-charge. Ragging is strictly prohibited on TNNLU Campus and there is zero tolerance for sexual harassment.

ICT Infrastructure

The Information and Communication Technology Department (ICTD) and the IT Committee coordinate and manage the networking and connectivity to the worldwideweb and all online classes and activities. The ICTD has high-speed internet connection from BSNL. Further, a second line has been taken from the Software Technology Park of India in order to ensure uninterrupted connectivity in the campus, round-the-clock and the whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

Sports facilities

An active body is essential for an active mind. TNNLU has all basic infrastructure for sports activities and a state-of-the-art modern gymnasium is also available in the Amenities Block for keeping oneself active and physically fit. TNNLU has a full time Coach for guiding and training the students in sports activities. The following modern sports facilities are present on the campus:

Health services at TNNLU

TNNLU Health Centre has a doctor on campus available every working day and a qualified nurse, available in the University round the clock. For any emergency, the university community will have access to the ambulance (service of the Government of Tamil Nadu) stationed in the TNNLU campus catering also to the people in the nearby places. Further, a qualified Counselor is available every working day in the University campus for the TNNLU fraternity. Utmost care is taken to maintain confidentiality in offering this service. All professional and ethical standards are duly maintained in extending these medical and counseling services.

Other facilities on TNNLU

The Tamil Nadu National Law University Sub-Post Office of the India Post with a distinct Postal Index Number Code (PIN Code) 620027 is functioning in the Amenities Block. It also doubles as India Post payments bank. The Tamil Nadu National Law School Branch of the UCO Bank (Branch Code 3003) offers banking services including ATM. And an additional ATM of the UCO Bank and ATMs of a few other banks are available within a radius of 3 kilometers from the University campus. The canteen in the amenities block is a favorite spot for tasty food and chitchat. Aavin milk parlor is yet another spot where students hang out in the evenings, enjoying a view of the sports ground, amidst the greenery around.

Minimum Eligibility and Seat Matrix:**UG Programme:****Minimum Eligibility:**

- In order to seek admission to the U.G. programmes it is mandatory to have a pass in 10+2 or an equivalent examination with not less than
 - forty five percent (45%) marks or its equivalent grade for candidates of all categories except SC/ST
 - forty percent (40%) marks or its equivalent grade for candidates belonging to SC/ST categories
- Candidates who are appearing in the qualifying examination in March/April, 2022 are also eligible to appear in CLAT 2022. However, they shall be required to produce evidence of their passing the qualifying examination at the time of admission, failing which they shall lose their right to be considered for admission.

 B.Com. LL.B.(Hons.) - Maximum intake 60 students

Admissions to these programmes are on merit, subject to rules of reservation, through the Common Law Admission Test only.

*For the T.N Government School Student Quota, a total of four seats are allotted. Of which, two seats are allotted to General and BC(O) category and the other 2 seats are to be allotted by the order of rotation in every admission i.e., M.B.C/DNC / S.C (O) / B.C (M) / S.C (A)/ST. For the admission to the Academic Year 2022-23, the 2 seats under such rotation shall be given to MBC/DNC and SC (O). The rotation shall fall on the next three turns (BC(M)/ SC (A)/ ST) in the group for the admission to the next academic year and shall continue so on and so forth. Where adequate number of students studied in Government schools are not available for admission to the seats set apart on preferential basis, such unfilled seats shall be filled up with the students who

studied in private schools (Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate professional courses on preferential basis to students of Government Schools Act,2021 (Act No.14 of 2021).

1. In order to seek admission to the P.G. programmes it is mandatory to have a pass in 3 years/5 years B.L. or LL.B. or B.L. (Hons.) or LL.B. (Hons.) or its equivalent B.A. LL.B. (Hons.)/B.Com. LL.B.(Hons.) Degree or an equivalent examination with not less than

- a. fifty five percent (55%) marks or its equivalent grade in case of candidates belonging to unreserved/OBC/Specially Abled Persons (SAP) and other categories
- b. fifty percent (50%) marks or its equivalent grade in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST categories

2. Candidates who are appearing in the qualifying examination in April/May, 2022 are also eligible to appear in CLAT 2022. However, they shall be required to produce evidence of their passing the qualifying examination at the time of admission, failing which they shall lose their right to be considered for admission.

Seats Distribution: [Total – 18 Seats]

Admissions to these programmes are on merit, subject to rules of reservation, through the Common Law Admission Test only.
