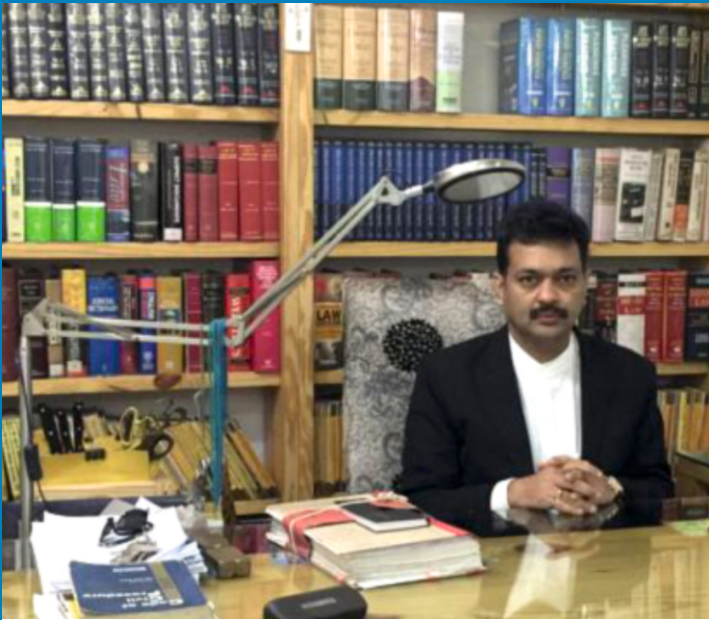

Moot Court helps the students of law in practical legal training to build analytical reasoning, legal aptitude, exploit the team-resources and above all, make them responsive and ready to take up law-practice after completion of their degree course.

RAGGING IS AN OFFENCE REWARD IS JAIL

Ragging in any form by any student inside or outside the Innovative Institute of Law campus or hall of residence is strictly prohibited. As per the judgement of Honourable Supreme Court ragging in any form is a punishable heinous crime. As per the latest amendment to UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, ragging is defined as-

“Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence, and economic background”.

Innovative Institute of Law has constituted Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-Ragging Squad for preventing ragging in college campus and in Hostel. CCTV cameras are installed at all locations known to be vulnerable to occurrences of ragging incidents.

“Anti-Ragging Helpline” means the Helpline established by the UGC under UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, in 2009 under UGC Act 1956. Its purpose is to achieve the objective of eliminating ragging, within the institution or outside.

ANTI-RAGGING MEASURES

PUNISHMENTS:-

As per the UGC and BCI following actions can be taken by the Institute depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution. The possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:-

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
4. Withholding results
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
7. Cancellation of admission
8. Rustication from the institution for the period as decided
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
10. Fine ranging between Rupees 25,000/- and Rupees 1 lakh
11. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
